The tour, titled "Living Large in Small Spaces" features condos and small homes designed by Walter White, Hugh Kaptur, Harold Bissner, William Krisel and more. Included with the tour are some interior home reveals and a catered reception.

The tours begin and end at Kings Point (Kaptur) and also include Sands and Shadows (Bissner), Sandpiper (Krisel) and several small homes (White and others) bordered by east Shadow Mountain and Edgehill. These homes have an interesting history, and your docent tour guide



will share the complete story. There are four tours: on February 22 and 23, two tours each day, one starting at 9:15 AM and one at 9:30 AM. The tours are 2½ hours, and tickets are \$55.



Oral History Project

Hi everyone, Leslie Roth here. It's that time again: wrapping up the end of the year and getting ready for the new year. Speaking of wrapping things up, the Legacy Interview Project is moving along. It has been a distinct honor for me to meet with almost 30 people now.

The inspiration started with HSPD Archivist Rochelle McCune, who mentioned that there was a need for new oral histories. Previously, there had been some interviews done by Hal Rover and Brett Romer, and before that, in the late 1970's through the early 1980's, over 50 oral histories were done by a professional interviewer from Fullerton State. These were mainly of the early pioneers, and they are posted on the Internet Archive. To listen to them, go to:

I so enjoy interviewing our wonderful residents. Technology has greatly improved the functionality of the interview process. I pre-interview on the phone, followed by a visit with the interviewee, usually at the Firehouse. It takes about an hour. I simply use my iPhone and have a designated spot with good lighting, or I can go to the interviewee's house. I sit behind the camera and off we go! 





